

Accelerated Engineering Degree Programme

CentraleSupélec is organising the 2018 edition of the Accelerated Engineering Degree Programme. This programme is intended for international students completing a Bachelor's degree in sciences or engineering at non-French universities. Selected students will join CentraleSupélec in September 2019 and obtain the engineering degree in only two years. Selection is done through an entrance exam. The programme can be delivered entirely in English.

In 2017, 9 students from the best universities in China and in the United States successfully passed the examinations and were invited to start the Accelerated Engineering Degree Programme in September 2018 in one of the following tracks:

- Mathematics/Computer Science
- Physics
- Mechanical Engineering
- Electrical Engineering

For the 2019 edition of the programme, the application deadline is set to 8th June 2018.

Selected candidates will be invited to sit the examinations that will take place in September:

- 6th September 2018 the written examinations in Paris, Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Moscow, Bucharest or Belgrade
- 10th 14th September 2018 the oral examinations in Paris or Beijing.

For candidates coming from a partner university as well as top 10 candidates, tuition fees are reduced to 12 000€/year. There are a number of excellence grants available each year.
